

THIS WEEK'S EXPERIMENT:

Indestructible

(Matthew 6:19-21, 24)

“Do not put away riches for yourselves on earth. Moths and rust can destroy them. Thieves can break in and steal them. Instead, put away riches for yourselves in heaven. There, moths and rust do not destroy them. There, thieves do not break in and steal them. Your heart will be where your riches are...



No one can serve two masters at the same time. He will hate one of them and love the other. Or he will be faithful to one and dislike the other. You can't serve God and Money at the same time.”

1. What is your most prized possession? Your favorite toy? The most important thing in your house?
2. Why are these items most important to you and your family?
3. How would you feel if something happened to them? All of these “things” can be destroyed in lots of different ways. Jesus says we should gather up things or “treasures” in heaven. What are some of the treasures you think Jesus was talking about?
4. Brainstorm together a short list of “treasures” you can store up in heaven. These will all be things that cannot be destroyed by fire, tornado, dog chewing on it, etc.
5. **THIS WEEK'S EXPERIMENT: Indestructible – Think about the list of “treasures” you can up with as a family. Your experiment this week is to find destructible items that can represent your list of indestructible treasures. Set your “treasure trinkets” in a place where you will be reminded about your treasures in heaven (for example, the breakfast table, dashboard of the car, next to your toothbrush...)**
